
Liz is the lead for the Early Action Together Programme Public Health Wales and Police Partnership; taking an ACE informed public health approach to policing and criminal justice. In her time with Barnardos Liz has managed a varied portfolio of services including family support, wellbeing, domestic abuse, school based counselling and children with disabilities. Starting her career in acute mental health, Liz completed a psychology degree and worked in residential and community settings, specialising in mental health and autism. Qualifying as a Social Worker, Liz was employed in Youth Offending Services. Liz has experience in developing new and innovative ideas which improve

outcomes for children, young people and adults, such as the Newport Collaborative Partnership, the Reflect Service and the B-CAWAC developed with Professor Gordon Harold; an outcomes assessment tool for children affected by parental factors such as inter-parental conflict.
